From the desk of Bobby Mann, DMD your LDS President. . . .

My thoughts on this Holiday Season, whatever your denomination, even if you do not have one, or if you have one but are not a participant, ie. you are secular... the bottom line, it is truly all about LOVE. "Love is never having to say I'm sorry," ... seems like I remember that from Ryan O'Neal-Ali McGraw in THE LOVE STORY, an outstanding movie from the 70's. LOVE is about GIVING and as with most value systems, it should begin at home... setting the example, so that our children or mentees will follow the GIVING standard which you have established. Will you acknowledge that our children are our greatest asset? Then below are 5 ways to teach your kids the art of GIVING this holiday season. "The key is to make the act of GIVIMG interesting to children so that they will want to make philanthropy a part of their lives," so says Jean Shafiroff.

The following was taken from CNBC:

LEAD BY EXAMPLE and do it together. Your kids emulate you. If they see you give, they will give, and this should begin at a young age. Find a "cause" that you and your child can participate in together. "By working together the parent can teach the child many of life's important skills as they relate to dealing with different kinds of people," Shafiroff says. A sense of bonding can ensue from this endeavor.

DO IT ALL THE TIME. Make GIVING a routine behavior, like other behavior taught to children, a giving spirit can be instilled. . .not just for the holidays. . . and not expecting anything in return. Activities that children love include walking dogs at an animal shelter and opening doors for strangers. Games that GIVE.

MAKE IT JOYOUS. While GIVING is meant to benefit someone else, it need not be a miserable chore or sacrifice for the GIVER. Packing meals for the homeless, singing Christmas songs at nursing homes.

USE IMAGINATION AND BE TIMELY. Author and speaker Robin Samora made a list of "50 ways to be Thankful and Show Random Acts of Kindness" that include simple reminders, like writing thank you notes, playing with a younger sister or brother and sharing a snack, passing out homemade Christmas tree decorations to strangers on the bus or carry extra umbrellas on rainy days.

COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS. "The Giving Book" teaches children to share in the pleasure that GIVING produces; it introduces the feeling that someone helped you or GAVE you something special. . .that you can make other people feel SPECIAL too. . . Make other people HAPPIER, HEALTHIER.

In the past it has been common practice to hire a professional artist to create the design for this poster. However, this year Governor Bevin and First Lady Glenna Bevin would like to encourage youth participation all over Kentucky by allowing students to create the design for the poster. The contest will kick off in January and students between freshman and senior years of high school will be invited to submit their designs through the website by February 17. Those in the contest should ask themselves what the Derby means to them.

Five finalists will be chosen and those five finalists will be invited to a luncheon at the Governor's Mansion in March. Each finalist will receive a prize at the luncheon and the winner will be announced. The winner will not only receive the prize the other four finalists received, but they will also be invited to attend the Kentucky Derby Festival Luncheon as well as the Governor's Derby Gala, along with his or her family. The Governor & First Lady will be in attendance at the luncheon. In addition, the winning design will be printed and sold around Louisville as well as traded with the Kentucky Derby Festival President.

This is not only a great way for students to use their creativity, but also presents a wonderful item to add to their resumes! We are asking you to promote this contest to your student patients and get as many kids involved as you can. There is a flyer on the next page of this newsletter that you can print and hang in your office where your patients can see it or you can make copies to give to your patients. **If you advertise this contest to your patients you will be recognized at the Derby Festival Luncheon.**

EPA Issues Final Rule Requiring Dental Practices To Use Amalgam Separators.

The <u>ADA News</u> (12/15, Garvin) reports the EPA released a final rule requiring that all dental practices nationwide install amalgam separators, stating in the final rule executive summary, "EPA has concluded that requiring dental offices to remove mercury through relatively low-cost and readily available amalgam separators and BMPs makes sense." The ADA commended the EPA, who listened to the association's input and incorporated the ADA House of Delegates' nine principles regarding a potential amalgam rule into the final product. In a statement, ADA President Dr. Gary L. Roberts said, "The ADA believes the Environmental Protection Agency's new federal regulation represents a fair and reasonable approach to the management of dental amalgam waste."

The ADA released a <u>statement</u> reaffirming its <u>position</u> that "dental amalgam is a durable, safe and effective cavity-filling option" and providing information for patients about restorative materials at <u>MouthHealthy.org</u>.
